

Stalling Area

(33% of Total Score)

Criteria:

1. Appearance
 - a. Stall should be identified using a 4-H/FFA stall card. Failure to do so may result in the judges not being able to locate and provide a score for your work.
 - b. Area around the animal should be clean of debris and raked.
 - c. Animal should be clean and well groomed.
 - d. If water and feed is present, then they should be clean.
 - e. Aisle area should be kept clear for safe passage of spectators.
 - f. Decorating your area is encouraged, if it is done in good taste.
 - g. Manure should be removed from the barn and disposed of in the designated area.
 - h. Exhibitor should be dressed appropriately.
 - i. Area should maintain a professional appearance that demonstrates evidence of proper animal care and grooming.
2. Educational Value
 - a. Educational materials related to the exhibited animal should be provided.
 - b. Educational material should not block the aisle.
 - c. Participant should be able to answer questions regarding their project.
3. Conduct
 - a. Participants should:
 - i. Cooperate with barn officials
 - ii. Display a positive attitude
 - iii. Assist others
 - iv. Be courteous to others
 - v. Answer questions from the public regarding their project.
 - b. Someone should be present at exhibit at all times.
 - c. Exhibitors should be on time for show classes and on sale day.
 - d. Inappropriate conduct will not be tolerated and you will lose points for herdsman. examples include but are not limited to:
 - i. Roughhousing
 - ii. Foul language
 - iii. Loud noises
 - e. As a member of 4-H and/or FFA, you are an ambassador for our community. Your actions in and outside of the barn should be appropriate.
